WHAT'S ON

RIVER DAMAGE AT THE VILLAGE HALL

A structural engineer and a surveyor have now been on-site to investigate the extent of the damage to the foundations to the boundary wall. They have been undercut by the river at the South end of the outbuildings behind the Hall and alongside the playground. Some stonework has already collapsed into the river. The Parish Council, owners of the playground, have agreed to share the survey costs with the Hall. Further updates will be provided in the August newsletter.

The Greening Campaign. Making our parish a greener place to live did not go as well as expected, only 64 out of 900 properties displayed the cards stating they were taking part, that's 7% of our residents. Please consider taking some of the following energy saving top tips: turn off lights when leaving the room; turn thermostat down 1°C; line dry clothes in summer; replace all bulbs with LEDs; boil only the water you need. One of the most important projects by the Parish Council is to judge public opinion on the New Abbey in Staveley. Do we want homes and care for older people in Staveley & Ings? The Abbey Care home is now closed and we have been asked to see what the community wants to do now. The site will be sold soon and the County would look favourably on a community proposal to buy the site. Do you agree that the Abbey building should be secured for the community and run on a not for profit basis? Or perhaps you think a private company should buy and develop the site? I spent ages trying to cross a busy road. A passer-by said, "there's a zebra crossing up the road." I replied, "then, he's having better luck than me!"

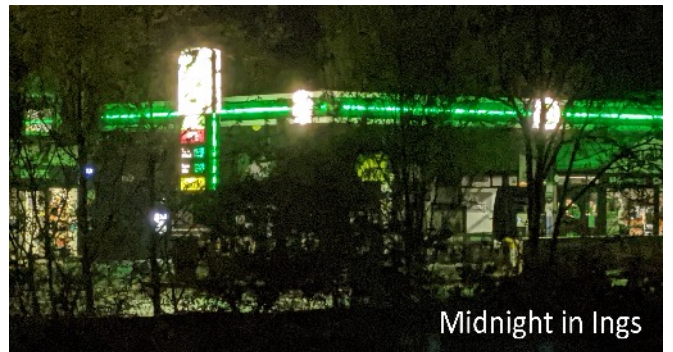
LAKE DISTRICT SHEEP DOG TRIALS, INGS, Thursday 5th August 2021 - 10am

The Lake District Sheep Dog Trials were first run in 1891 on the Howe Estate at Applethwaite, Windermere. They are currently held at Hill Farm, Ings by kind permission of the Buckley family. The Trials can be found in a field just off the Moor Howe Road.

The day starts at 10am with the Trials running all day. Also on the day are three hound trails, at 1pm, 3pm and 3.30pm. These set off from the Trials field and go out across the fields and out of sight towards Kentmere, swinging left handed towards Windermere and then coming back to the field for a noisy and exciting finish. Bets on which hound will win can be placed on the field.

Starting at 1pm there is an open dog show for sheep dogs, other breeds class and a class for puppies - all are welcome to enter - followed by a Terrier show. We have trade stands, a bar, ice cream van and food available all day. It is a lovely family day out; you can come for the whole day or just an hour or two and watch an age old, traditional Lakeland event. Adults £5, Children free, Parking on site.
