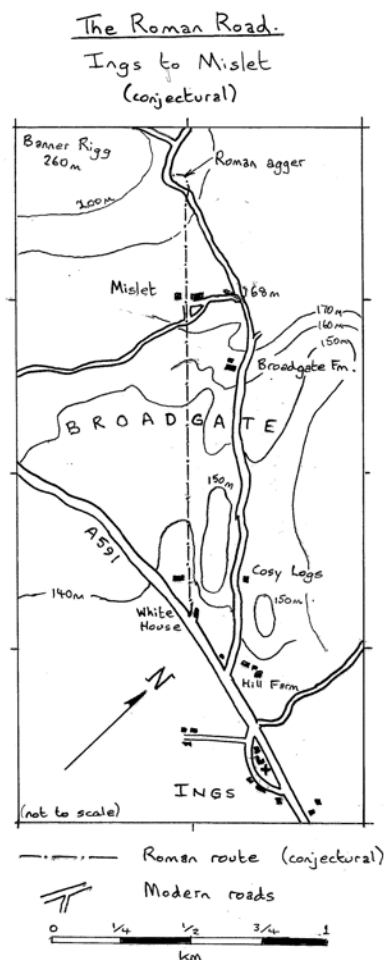
THE ROMAN ROAD THROUGH INGS

Staveley History Society led by David Ratledge, a renowned expert on laser ground surveys, walked part of the Roman Road through Ings on 15th July. The road is part of the route from Watercrock, Kendal to Galava, Ambleside, and thence over Dunmail Raise to the north. There is no evidence for a Roman road over High Street. The clearest evidence for the road in Ings lies on the lands of Mislet Farm. The route roughly followed the current line of the A591 from Staveley before striking NW at White House. The walkers are shown below standing on the clearly defined agger just to the NW of Mislet. The Roman Road thereafter roughly followed the Moor Howe Road toward Troutbeck.

The past year has been truly exceptional and affected us in many ways in Staveley and Ings, not least the workings of the Parish Council. We were challenged to proceed with a number of new projects including our new Community young person's opportunity award and finishing Jacks Corner in the centre of Staveley Village.

Public meetings were stopped but continued online. This did not replace the effectiveness of an in person meeting that has now resumed with limited numbers. We have been consulted on 54 planning applications and the council responded to all of these applications and submitted comments where appropriate.

The Parish council exists to represent the residents of Hugill, Nether Staveley and Over Staveley. Residents are welcome to attend meetings of the council and provision is made early in each meeting to raise matters of interest or concern.
