

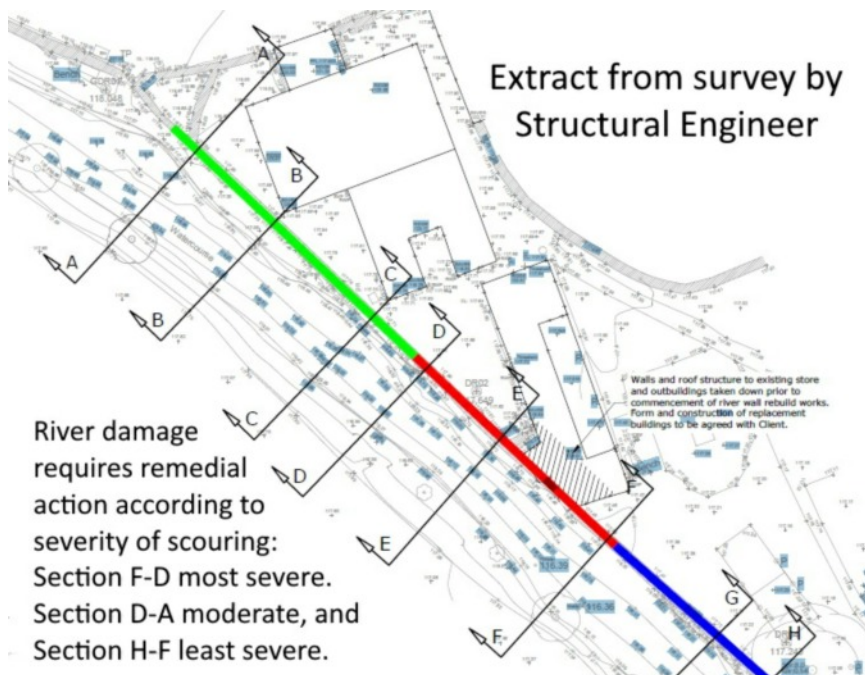

WHAT'S ON

RIVER DAMAGE AT VILLAGE HALL



Extract from survey by
Structural Engineer

River damage
requires remedial
action according to
severity of scouring:
Section F-D most severe.
Section D-A moderate, and
Section H-F least severe.

D-A: Extent of existing rubble stone wall to be re-pointed and missing stonework replaced.

F-D: Extent of wall to be demolished and replaced with new retaining wall and foundation (design TBC)

H-F: Extent of undermining where existing wall is to be retained with grout bags installed to fill voids beneath wall base/foundation.

The walls and roof of the hall outbuildings at their SW corner will require to be rebuilt. It is proposed to take the opportunity to remodel and possibly re-purpose the building which is currently used only for storage. The work will be carried out in two stages: firstly stabilising the river wall then work on the outbuildings. Once designs for the two stages of the work are agreed, quotes will be sought prior to finding funding, from grant funding bodies if possible and through our own fund raising efforts. STAVELEY WITH INGS PARISH COUNCIL - LATEST NEWS

All planning applications for Staveley and Ings can be seen in detail when the agenda and minutes are posted on the notice board next to the Village Hall. Items relating to Ings recently included the following. The Farm Visitors Centre, with the entrance off Grassgarth Lane, attracted some opposition to the application for a Liquor Licence extension for 7 days a week with a request to have live music. There was a planning application for an additional storage and display building at the rear of Biketreks, which was approved with conditions. Grassgarth Farm made an application to demolish two disused agricultural buildings to be replaced with cattery pens. Fairbank Farm's application for change of use of Agricultural Barns to wedding venue is still outstanding. LDNP are investigating a complaint about compliance re this application.

At the last public meeting, a query was raised regarding the advertising trailer parked in the field opposite the petrol station for over a year. Another comment was made re excessive advertising signage for the café at the petrol station, and also the sails that have appeared on the road up to The Lakeland Farm Centre. Planning Enforcement has been contacted and will be taking action where appropriate.

A large number of sandbags have been provided to the Parish Council for flood defence use if anyone requires any please contact the Parish Council. Booths supermarket has hosted a recycling bank since 1986. Unfortunately this facility will no longer be available after Sept 30th. There is a community plan being developed for Staveley and Ings. More information to follow.

Due to the departure of one of the Parish councillors there is a vacancy for a new councillor to represent the residents of Staveley and Ings if anyone is interested please contact the Parish Council.
