STAVELEY WITH INGS PARISH COUNCIL - LATEST NEWS

New councillors needed: Staveley with Ings Parish Council are looking for new Councillors. We have 3 vacancies due to the recent resignation of Peter Harrison, a long standing member. Lakes Line Community Rail Partnership: The Council remains an active member of this group which brings together community representatives, county-wide organisations and rail operatives on a quarterly basis under the umbrella of Community Rail Cumbria. This continues to be a difficult period for rail operator Northern. Usage is variable and not yet back to pre-pandemic levels. Reliability continues to be an issue, in part caused by staff shortages, and some working practices remain a subject of dispute. The inconsistent collection of fares at peak times continues to be a serious, unresolved issue which further distorts footfall figures. Looking ahead, the County Council has provided funds to develop the business case for a passing loop, located at Burneside, which will enable a more frequent service. Planning continues on a new transport hub at Windermere and Staveley's platform is to be extended to accommodate longer trains. Unfortunately, and unsatisfactorily, many are still unable to access the station and there remains no sign that this will change.

Lake District Sheepdog Trials -Thursday, 4th August 10:00

The Lake District Sheepdog trials are held at Hill Farm, Ings by kind permission of the Buckley family in a field just off the Moor Howe Road. The day starts at 10am with the Trials which run all day. Also on the day are 3 hound trails, running at 1pm, 2.15pm and 2.45pm, setting off from the Trials field and going out across the fields and up out of sight towards Kentmere, swinging left-handed towards Windermere and then coming back to the field for a noisy and exciting finish. Bets on which hound will win can be placed on the field.

Starting at 1pm there is an open dog show for sheep dogs, other breeds class and one for puppies. There is also a pet class so if any villagers wish to come for a day out and bring their pets, all are welcome to enter. These classes are followed by a Terrier show. We have trade stands, a bar, ice cream van and food available all day.

The Trial is an Open event so anyone can enter with any trained sheep dog irrespective of whether it has won a trial before or it is its first time. There are special prizes for the best Novice dog and best local entrant. The youngest competitor wins a new dog collar and there are special trophies for the best outrun failing to pen and kindest competitor.
