SOLAR PV for ST ANNE'S?

In order to offset some of the large increase in cost of electricity, parishioners are in the process of seeking to install solar PV panels and a storage battery. Planning permission for such an installation on a Grade 2* listed building is not straightforward but informal discussions with Historic England, under way since January, give grounds for optimism. An HE rep visited in August. His observations are:

"The proposals to install solar PV panels on the roof of the Church will result in harm to the significance of the building. However, we are conscious that the proposals are part of a response to real concerns about the impact of climate change, and link into the Church of England's call to be net-zero by 2030. Fundamentally the task for the church will be to demonstrate that the benefits of the proposals outweigh the harm that they will cause. With this in mind, further work is needed to supplement the current information provided, to allow for a complete understanding of the impact of the works to its significance, and to provide a clear and convincing justification.

We would, however, commend the success of previous projects to improve the viability and energy efficiency of the church, which have been carried out in a sensitive and considered manner. The current proposals form part of this overall holistic plan, and the church has already begun to put together a robust evidence base to support them."

Structural engineer's calculations and drawings are now in progress.

Staveley Station Extension to accommodate longer trains will occur between 05.09.22 and 21.11.22. There will be a station closure on Sundays 9 and 30 October.

Kent Catchment Flood Risk Management Scheme: To inform design proposals, a study is being carried out in Burneside, Staveley and Ings to investigate present river-wall construction by contractor VolkerStevin. This will help understand where flood defences could be located, and which walls could be re-used, modified or replaced if necessary. You may notice/have noticed contractors working, taking core samples etc.

07.09.22 Parish Council meeting: Cllr Riley informed the meeting that a letter has been received from Richard Leafe (chief Executive LDNPA), stating that contractors will be employed to remove unauthorised signage in Ings. This should commence in October.
