

Progress through the bureaucratic quagmire of planning approvals is stubbornly slow. An amber 'proceed with caution' from Historic England last Autumn encouraged us to commission full drawings and structural engineering calculations. They're now complete. You'll be pleased to know that the roof timbers are up to the extra loading. The tower will house the inverter and batteries. Applications have now gone off to the Lake District National Park and the Church planners. The timing of work will likely be affected by the maternity roost of Brown Long-eared Bats in the roof space. We're optimistic about the outcome though and will offer you the chance to contribute to a 'solar panel fund' when our plans have been approved.

In February this year, electricity charges to St. Anne's trebled. The annual value to St. Anne's of PV panels with battery is estimated to be about £2000 at today's prices, half the annual bill. The yearly kWh cost reduces by about £1200 with an export income of £800. Solar panels therefore impact positively the financial security of the church, helping to safeguard the use of the building for the foreseeable future.

The proposed installation will not only save over a quarter of the annual electricity consumption but the balance of solar generation will be exported to the Grid. The panels in conjunction with heat-pump, good levels of thermal insulation and LED lighting will thus enable St Anne's Church to become close to carbon zero, helping to address our climate change responsibilities.
