WHAT'S ON

TRAFFIC IN INGS VILLAGE



A new 20 mph speed restriction was recently introduced in Staveley, a very welcome development for residents and visitors alike. It does however beg the question - why is there not a 20 mph speed limit in Ings? The narrow lane in the centre of the village is frequented by Church and Hall users, visitors to the Watermill, the residents of

Meadowcroft Cottages, and Church Lane, families visiting the playground etc. The current limit of 40 mph is clearly inappropriate especially when there is no footpath, unlike Staveley, to separate pedestrians from the traffic. It seems there may be an opportunity to do something about this - please read the latest news from the Parish Council over the page and make your views known.

One also wonders why the national open road speed limit applies to Grassgarth Lane, Vicarage Lane and the Gated Road where a speed of 60 mph is similarly inappropriate?

ONE WAY TRAFFIC THROUGH INGS?

John Wood writes: The road through the village is narrow, made even more so by cars parked by: guests at Meadowcroft; residents at Church View; Village Hall users; Sunday worshippers and customers at the Watermill. The result of this is cars at 40 mph braking hard, reversing and driving too close to pedestrians. In addition to a 20 mph limit, a further remedy would be a one way system entering at the Watermill and leaving at Meadowcroft. Leaving at this end of the village is the safest exit to the main road. It would also prevent cars swinging into Church Lane at high speed by Meadowcroft. A one way through the village would stop cars having to reverse and no more near miss shunts.

STAVELEY WITH INGS PARISH COUNCIL - LATEST NEWS

Date of the next Staveley with Ings Parish Council meeting: Mon 2nd October at 7.15 at the Ayland Pavilion, Staveley

The minutes from the last meeting mentioned the following in the public participation: Traffic on the A591 was speeding away from the speed cameras. The cross hatching on the A591 had not been painted back on. This work has now been completed. Highways issues are to be followed up through the highways department. Work on the bridge leading to the Northern section of Grassgarth Lane has now been completed.

Moles in Playground: A second company has been asked to sort out the mole problem in the Ings playground as there was no success from the first company, unfortunately the new company is having problems but is still trying.

Planning applications: There were six new applications, eight applications determined and six still outstanding. For more information please contact the Parish Clerk who can send you a copy of the 6th September minutes.

Speed limit in Ings Village: Highways and Transport Strategic Board are reviewing the 20mph speed limit. Local authorities are encouraged to consider the introduction of more 20mph speed limits in urban areas and built up village streets, that were primarily residential, to ensure greater safety for pedestrians and cyclists. Each proposed scheme would require a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce a 20mph speed limit with informal consultation to be undertaken with any objections being heard at Westmorland and Furness Locality Boards ahead of the decision to approve each scheme. Weight of local opinion is an important factor in the decision making.
