WHAT'S ON

SOLAR PANELS FOR ST ANNE'S CHURCH - THE LEGAL CHALLENGE

The last update on the saga was in the February 2024 Newsletter. We were then awaiting the decision of the Chancellor of the Diocese, James Fryer Spedding, the Planning Committee of the Diocese of Carlisle having firmly recommended our proposals to him. The Chancellor is also obliged to consider the views of Historic England and The National Park, together with other historic amenity societies. His decision becomes the 'official' verdict of the Church of England.

It was in May that we received a positive judgement. The Chancellor accepted that whilst the solar panels would cause 'less than substantial harm' to the architectural heritage of the building, this was balanced out by a number of factors: the installation is completely reversible and can be removed at the end of its useful life; the need to mitigate against climate change, and the benefits to future financial security and of affordable building usage.

Unfortunately, this decision does not overrule that of the National Park, but it has provided good grounds for appealing the National Park's verdict. Consequently, we initiated a legal challenge to the Secretary of State under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990. The Planning Inspector appointed to make the ruling visited in mid-September and we await the outcome.

The next Parish council meeting is on Monday 7th October in the Ayland Pavilion Staveley at 7.15 pm. There are several items on the agenda concerning planning applications in Ings, along with a number of applications in Staveley.

At the last Parish Council meeting there was a presentation by United Utilities. The community plan was updated and, after a consultation with residents, the council nominated green spaces in the village along the main road that are to be excluded from any potential planning applications.

It was noted that the moles in the parish playground were back and permission was given for them to be removed. There is a repair required on part of the playground wall and an order was raised to complete this work.

Work to paint the fascia boards on the bus shelter on the south side of the A591 has been completed and, weather permitting, the North side bus shelter painting will be completed during October.

It was also agreed that a new Notice Board was required outside the Ings Parish Hall and a grant has been made available to replace the existing one.
