WHAT'S ON

SAFETY ON THE A591

Staveley-with-Ing's Parish Council has set up a sub-committee to investigate possible road improvements within the Parish. In Ing's, the main issue is whether the speed limit on the A591 should be lowered from the current 40mph, to 30mph. Crossing the main road is necessary for anyone from the north side of the village to access the shops, church, village hall and pub, or for anyone using the footpath and cycle-way between Staveley and Windermere. It can be fraught and dangerous, especially for our more elderly residents.

Lowering the speed limit isn't within the Parish Council's power – we would need to convince Westmorland & Furness Council. Therefore, we are preparing a questionnaire for residents, and visitors, about the current use of the road crossings, and possible improvements. It is hoped to circulate this in the Spring.

We are also considering whether, due to greatly increased traffic, a speed limit/other safety measures might benefit Moor Howe Lane.

Finally, we have made representations to Westmorland & Furness Highways Department regarding more salt bins on Moor Howe Lane, and Grassgarth Lane; both steep roads, and untreated by the Council. So far, we have not been successful, but we will persevere!

Ings matters raised at Parish Council meetings on Nov 27th and Jan 5th include:

The car with advertising for local Holiday caravans had been parked again on the verge at Grassgarth Lane in Ings, damaging the grass and distracting traffic. Cllr Bromley agreed to speak to the owner before the Clerk was instructed to report it to Westmorland and Furness Council.

Councillors discussed what level to set the precept for the coming year. There is an expected, as yet unknown but significant expense to fix the river wall next to the playground (which the Parish Council owns).

Despite a request for grit bins on Moor Howe and Grassgarth lanes, Westmorland and Furness Council have declined to provide them stating the area did not meet their criteria. Councillors agreed to investigate the matter more as it was felt the provision of bins would be a boost to road safety.

A previous report of the decaying flowerbox at Ings was highlighted. Councillors agreed on a replacement box.

Several planning applications were discussed, full details are available on the website.
